CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama on the Joint Petition and Stipulation of the Alabama Board of Medical Examiners and the Respondent, JULIO DELGADO, M.D., entered on the 17th day of October, 2018. The Commission hereby finds that it has jurisdiction over this petition, stipulation, and the parties hereto, pursuant to Ala. Code § 34-24-361. In consideration of the Stipulation of the parties, which is incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, the Commission hereby finds that the Respondent, JULIO DELGADO, M.D., has committed acts which violate Ala. Code §§ 34-24.360(4) and (6); specifically, Dr. Delgado has been convicted in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Alabama of the felony offense of aiding and abetting the acquisition of a controlled substance by subterfuge, a violation of Title 21 U.S.C. § &43(a)(3) and Title 18 U.S.C. § 2. The Commission concludes, as a matter of law, that the foregoing facts constitute violations of Ala. Code §§ 34.24.360(4) and 360(6).

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, it is the ORDER of the Medical Licensure Commission:

1. That the license to practice medicine of Respondent, Julio Delgado, M.D.,


license number MD 215213, be, and is hereby RESTRICTED. The restrictions on his license are:

- a. Dr. Delgado shall not order, administer, dispense, or prescribe Schedule II controlled substances;
- b. Dr. Delgado shall abide by and remain in compliance with all terms of his federal probation in case number 2:17-CR-511- WKW-GMB; and
- c. Dr. Delgado shall not prescribe controlled substances to family members; and
- d. These Restrictions shall remain in effect until lifted by the Commission. The Commission shall lift said restrictions upon the expiration of thirty-six (36) months or the completion of Dr. Delgado's federal probation, whichever is greater, and upon a showing by Dr. Delgado of compliance with the terms of this order.

2. That Dr. Delgado be, and is hereby assessed an administrative fine in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). The administrative fine is due and payable to the Medical Licensure Commission within thirty (30) days of the date of this Consent Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any failure by Dr. Delgado to comply with any or all of the restrictions imposed by this Order may result in an extension of these restriction beyond the time frame set out herein and/or the filing of a new administrative complaint for the revocation of Dr. Delgado's medical license.
